Year: 1 Term: Autumn Term 2

African Safari

English

Reading

We continue to work on our reading every day in daily phonics lessons. When reading we will work on comprehension skills and developing our use of expression when reading, particularly when a character is speaking to show what they are thinking and / or feeling.

Writing

In class we are learning about the features and grammar aspects of letters. You can support your child by showing them letters that you receive through the post and talk about what they see e.g. the date, address, greeting.

We will also look at ways of up levelling our work by ensuring that punctuation marks are placed accurately in our writing. At home, please ensure that your child is aware that capital letters are used at the beginning of the sentences and for proper nouns (names etc). Continue to build on children understanding of correct use of punctuations in their writing for example full stops, question marks and exclamations marks.

Mathematics

Arithmetic

For maths this term children will have a lot of practise with counting in multiples of 10's and will begin to add multiples of ten, a hundred and thousands.

Geometry

In geometry, children will be naming and describing the features of common 2D shapes. Children will also begin to identify the perimeter of these 2D shapes. Children will start to use a ruler to record the length of a straight line.

Data & Measure

This term children will begin to measure and record lengths, height and mass. When measuring lengths children will use a ruler to recognise how long or wide something is. Whilst recording mass, children will use a scale to identify how heavy an object is.

Topic:

Our topic this term is African Safari. Through a range of activities, the children will explore traditional music, arts and crafts. The children will look closely at clothes, artefacts and photos from various African countries.

Geography

The children will begin to use an atlas/globe in order to locate Africa on a map. They will compare the landscape between different regions in Africa to that of London. The children will learn about the features of safari animals and how these features enable them to survive.

RE:

This term we will be learning about Christian festival of Christmas. We will discuss why Christmas is important to some people and how they celebrate this festival.

Science

This term the children will compare and sort animals according to their features. They will begin to name and label animal body parts. The children will continue to develop their scientific skills by completing surveys and recording information on tables and graphs.

Important information

Homework

Children are provided with literacy and maths homework books which will now be given on the same day as Homework club-**Thursday**. Homework is due back on Monday.

Spellings

Along with the homework, spellings will also be given out on **Thursday**. Please do not practise the spellings in their spelling books. The spelling book is due back on Monday so that the children can complete their spelling test in them.

Reading books

Reading books will be changed every Friday and parents are asked to comment or sign in the space provided in their reading logs.

PE Kits

PE kits should be in school on a Monday and be taken home on a Friday. A PE kit consists of: white T-shirt, blue shorts or leggings and black plimsolls. **Due to the change in weather please ensure the children are wearing jogging bottom or leggings.**

Uniform

Please ensure that ALL your child's clothes (including book bags and P.E bag) are clearly labelled with your child's name and class.
