

### PUPIL PREMIUM – 2016 – 2017

Under the Government Pupil Premium scheme, Salisbury received £270,600 for the academic year 2016 – 2017 to support children who are entitled to free school meals, £700 for LAC and £2659 for Early Years Pupil Premium which totals to £273,959.
